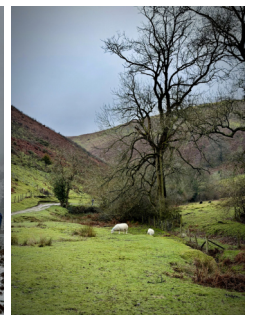


BIG SCHOOLS' BIRDWATCH



Pupils volunteered to help their local wildlife by taking part in the RSPB's Big Schools' Birdwatch. The Birdwatch involved watching and counting the birds that visited the school grounds, before submitting the results to the RSPB. The Birdwatch was a chance to participate in a UK-wide citizen science project. The most numerous birds our team spotted were pigeons, gulls and robins.

With over a million school children taking part since its launch in 2002, the RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch has become a much-loved annual event, that helps give the RSPB a valuable snapshot of how our school birds are doing in the UK. With birds now facing so many challenges due to the nature and climate emergency, every count matters.



TWO DAY ARTHOG ADVENTURE
